- 1. <u>Balancing Mission Readiness and Public Health</u>: In accordance with reference (a), the following supplemental order to references (b) and (c) is issued, *effective immediately*. These modifications are issued to protect public health and mitigate the effects of the Coronavirus Disease 2019 Pandemic (COVID-19) by limiting unnecessary personal interactions and maximizing social distancing. All hands and tenants shall achieve compliance within twenty four (24) hours and report completion with these requirements to NBG Emergency Operations Center (EOC) via email to <u>M-GU-NBG-EOC-BTLWTCH@fe.navy.mil</u> or telephonically to (671) 333-2781/2784 or (671) 333-6455.
- 2. <u>Health Protection Condition (HPCON) CHARLIE</u>: NBG and all tenants will set HPCON CHARLIE. In addition to all measures from previous risk levels, additional HPCON CHARLIE measures are provided in enclosure (1).
- 3. Force Health Protection Enclaves (FHPE): NBG has implemented FHPEs at various locations onboard the installation, including installation entry control points (ECPs). All personnel requiring access to the installation and these areas are subject to enhanced COVID-19 screening, including screening questionnaires, temperature checks, and other measures as required, in accordance with enclosure (2).
- a. <u>Mission Critical Personnel (MCP)</u>. Access to and operations onboard NBG will continue to be limited to Mission Essential Personnel (MEP) as defined in Reference (b). However, NBG and all tenants shall identify Mission Critical Personnel (MCP) in support of executing FHPE CONOPS, Enclosure (2), and mission critical operations, activities and investments (OA&I).
- 1) Authority to determine mission critical OA&I and MCP support these OA&I is hereby delegated to Commanding Officers (COs) and Officers-in-Charge (OICs) of all tenants. For non-military tenants, this authority is delegated to the NBG Executive Officer (XO).

2) Strict adherence to this definition is required to further understand requirements to protect continuing campaign plan execution and maintain mission readiness for contingency/operation plan execution while allowing Defense Support to Civil Authorities/Foreign Humanitarian Assistance, if required.

4. Off-Base Travel and Movements of Mission Essential Personnel (MEP):

- a. To the greatest extent practicable, NBG and all tenant personnel will act in accordance with the lawfully issued public health emergency declarations made by the Governor of Guam. However, in accordance with enclosure (3), federal law exempts military and federal civilian personnel from state and local government orders when necessary to perform official duties. Commanding Officers and Officers-in-Charge may direct MEP under their authority to continue to perform official duties and, if required, exempt them from restriction of movement orders imposed by the Government of Guam.
- b. MEP ordered to official duties, if encountered by Guam Police Department or other law enforcement during such travel, shall identify themselves using their DoD identification card and explain the nature of their work and travel. If MEP are detained by local law enforcement while on official business, they should contact the Naval Criminal Investigative Service Resident Agency (NCISRA) Marianas at (671) 339-7220. All personnel while off base and not in the performance of official duties shall comply with all Government of Guam orders.
- 5. <u>Mitigation Measures</u>: All personnel are again *strongly encouraged* to stay in their homes and *travel only for essential purposes*, that is to and from work or to obtain necessities, including food, medicine, or other essential items. Personnel should *not* utilize off-base gyms or exercise classes. Personnel should always *maintain appropriate social distancing*, that is no less than six (6) feet between persons. Persons who are experiencing flu-like symptoms should *shelter-in-place* and contact the U.S. Naval Hospital (USNH) Guam Medical Screening Call Center at (671) 333-2772/2773/2774.
- 6. <u>Enforcement</u>: Any person who refuses to obey or otherwise violates an order during the declared public health emergency may be detained. Those not subject to military law may be detained until civil authorities can respond. Violators of procedures, protocols, provisions, or orders issued in conjunction with the public health emergency may be charged with a crime under the Uniform Code of Military Justice and under Section 271 of Title 42, United States Code (U.S.C.). Pursuant to Section 271 of Title 42, U.S.C., violators are subject to a fine up to \$1,000 or imprisonment for not more than one year, or both.
